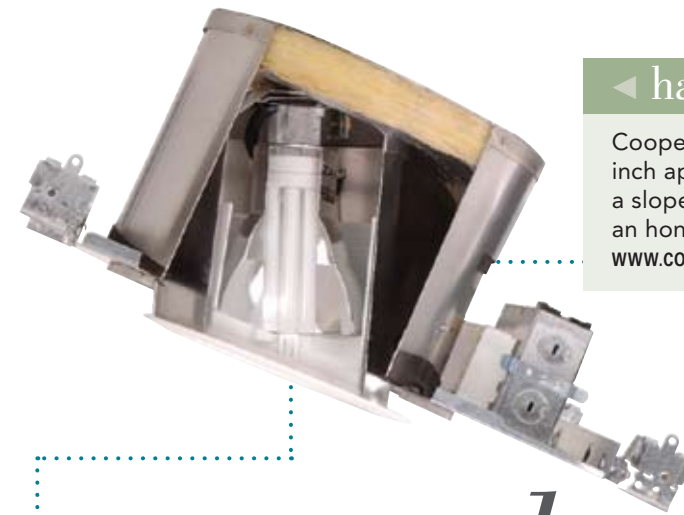
brigantine from maxlite ▶

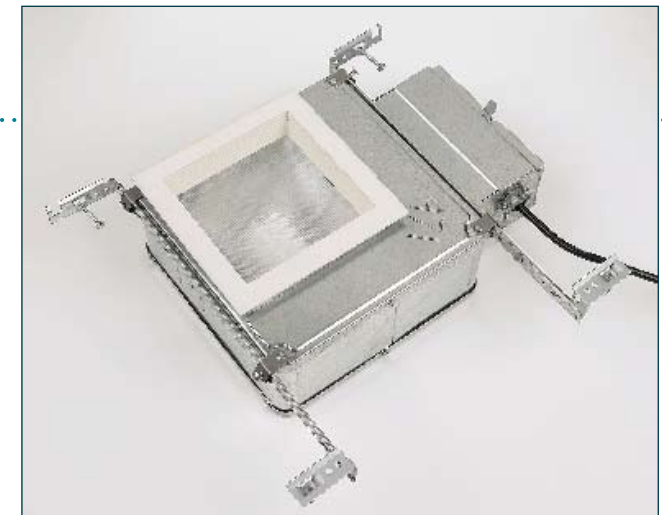

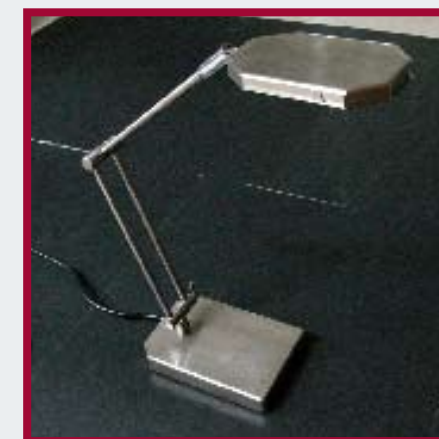
